
OUR VISION IS:

THE 3 GUIDING PRINCIPLES OF SELF-WORTH, ENGAGEMENT AND PURPOSE PROVIDE A CLEAR EXPLANATION OF WHAT WE BELIEVE IN AND HOW WE EXPECT PEOPLE TO BEHAVE. THESE ARE SUPPORTED BY THE 8 CONDITIONS:

1. SELF-WORTH

Self-Worth begins when we experience a sense of Belonging [1]: We feel like we are part of the school community while being recognised and appreciated for our uniqueness. We also experience Self-Worth when someone in our lives believes in us.

We need Heroes [2]: people we can look up to, respect, and learn from.

To develop Self-Worth, we also need a Sense of Accomplishment [3]. We must be recognised as much for our effort, perseverance, and citizenship as we are for high grades and good test scores. As we build Self-Worth, we are more likely to persevere through difficult tasks and be inspired to take the steps needed to reach our goals.

2. ENGAGEMENT

Engagement means we are emotionally, intellectually, and behaviourally engaged in our learning and work. When we are emotionally engaged, we experience Fun & Excitement [4] by becoming so involved that we lose track of time. At the end of a lesson or task, we wonder, "Where did that time go?"

When we are intellectually engaged, we ask "Why?" or "Why not?" about the world around us. Curiosity & Creativity [5] are alive in how we learn, fostering inquisitiveness and a desire for new discoveries.


When we are behaviourally engaged, we have a Spirit of Adventure [6]. We are not afraid to try new things, or to take on healthy challenges, whether we might succeed or fail. With Engagement, learning becomes important in and of itself.

3. PURPOSE

Schools must challenge us to think about our Purpose—who we want to become as well as what we want to be. To reach this goal, we need to explore what it means to have, and create, a successful and rewarding life and to pursue our work with intention and commitment. Purpose is about being responsible, accountable, and confident.


To develop Purpose, we need the opportunity to assume Leadership & Responsibility [7] in our lives. We must learn to make decisions and understand the consequences of our choices.
